Flow is a visually captivating, wordless animated film set in a post-human world where nature reclaims the planet after a catastrophic flood. It follows a resilient stray cat - alone at first - who forms an unexpected community on a sailboat with other animal survivors: a capybara, a lemur, a dog, and a bird. Together, they navigate the flooded forests and submerged ruins.

The film explores themes of adaptation, ecological balance, and the cooperation needed to survive environmental change. Using beautiful animation created with just open-source software, its silent storytelling becomes a powerful allegory for climate resilience and the fragile beauty of our ecosystems. While it reflects on humanity's impact, Flow ultimately offers a hopeful vision of interdependence, community, and empathy, where every gesture and interaction carries deep emotional weight.

Flow huwa film animat, viżwalment affaxxinanti, u bla kliem. Hu ambjentat f'dinja post-umana fejn in-natura qed tirkupra wara għargħar katastrofiku. Il-film isegwi l-vjaġġ ta' qattus mitluf imma reżiljenti - li jibda waħdu - li jifforma komunità mhux mistennija fuq dgħajsa ma' annimali oħra: capybara, lemur, kelb, u għasfur. Flimkien, jinnavigaw il-foresti mgħarrqa u l-fdalijiet mgħaddsa fl-ilma.

Il-film jesplora temi bħall-adattament għat-tibdil, il-bilanċ ekoloġiku, u l-kooperazzjoni meħtieġa biex wieħed jissopravvivi waqt il-bidla ambjentali. Bl-użu ta' animazzjoni l-gmiel tagħha, maħluqa b'semplicità *software open-source*, ir-rakkont sieket ta' dan il-film jinbidel f'allegorija qawwija għar-reżiljenza għall-klima u s-sbuħija fragli tal-ekosistemi tagħna. Filwaqt li jirrifletti fuq l-impatt tal-umanità, Flow fl-aħħar mill-aħħar joffri viżjoni ta' tama bbażata fuq l-interdipendenza, il-komunità u l-empatija, fejn kull għagir u interazzjoni jgħorru piż emozzjonali profund.

In the drought-prone lands of Turkana, Kenya, an oil discovery promises wealth and development. But for the pastoral women of this ancestral community, it threatens to snatch away their sovereignty, their land, and their way of life. This powerful short documentary follows Selina Asekon Chumchum and a group of resilient women as they organise to stand against the dual forces of a multinational oil giant and the deep-seated patriarchy of their own community.

Oil and Water is more than a story of environmental conflict; it is a profound portrait of courage and a fight for justice. The film masterfully weaves together themes of climate justice, Indigenous rights, and gender equality, revealing how these struggles are inextricably linked. As promises of jobs and water fail to materialise, the women emerge as the clear-sighted guardians of their community's future, challenging corrupt politics and greed to protect what is most sacred.

Fl-artijiet ta' Turkana, il-Kenja, artijiet suxxettibli hafna għan-nixfa, jinstab iż-żejt bi prospettti ta' ġid u żvilupp. Madanakollu, għan-nisa li jaħdmu l-art f'din il-komunità, din l-iskoperta thedded is-sovranià tagħhom, arthom, u l-mod tal-ħajja tagħhom. Dan id-dokumentarju qasir isegwi lil Selina Asekon Chumchum u grupp ta' nisa reżiljenti sħabha waqt li jorganizzaw ruħhom biex jieħdu azzjoni kontra l-forzi ġganteski multinazzjonali taż-żejt u l-forzi patrijarkali magħgħuna sew fil-komunità tagħhom stess.

Oil and Water hu iktar minn sempliċiment storja ta' kunflitt ambjentali; hu ritratt profund tal-kuraġġ u ġlieda favur il-ġustizzja. Il-film jinsegħ flimkien it-temi tal-ġustizzja klimatika, id-drittijiet Indijeni, u l-ugwaljanza bejn is-sessi, filwaqt li jikxef kif dawn il-ġliediet huma marbuta b'mod inseparabbli. Hekk kif il-wegħdiet tal-impjegi u l-ilma ma jimmaterjalizzawx, in-nisa juru li huma huma l-gwardjani b'viżjoni ċara tal-futur tal-komunità tagħhom, waqt li jisfidaw il-politika korrotta u r-regħba biex jipproteġu dak li hu l-aktar sagru.

Spring hunting in Malta is one of the island's most divisive issues, where a centuries-old tradition collides with ecological fragility and shifting cultural values. *Birds without Borders* traces this evolution - from a practice once rooted in survival to a deeply polarised debate about legality, conservation, and identity within the EU context. Set against Malta's striking landscapes, the film highlights the fragile balance between human customs and the natural rhythms of bird migration.

Through perspectives from hunters, activists, and community members, the documentary lays bare the emotions and tensions surrounding this tradition. At the same time, it broadens the conversation beyond Malta's shores, reminding us of the global responsibility to protect migratory species and safeguard ecosystems under strain.

Il-kaċċa fir-rebbiegħa hija waħda mill-iktar kwistjonijiet jaħarqu f'Malta, fejn tradizzjoni ta' sekli sħaħ tħabbatha kontra l-fraġilità ekoloġika u l-valuri kulturali li dejjem jinbidlu. *Birds without Borders* isegwi din l-evoluzzjoni - mill-prattika li kellha għeruqha imsejsa fis-sopravivenza għal dibattitu jaħraq ħafna dwar il-legalità, il-konservazzjoni, u l-identità fil-kuntest tal-UE. Fl-isfond tal-pajsaġġ majestuwż Malti, il-film jenfasizza l-bilanċ fraġli bejn id-drawwiet tal-bniedem u r-ritmi naturali tal-migrazzjoni tal-għasafar.

Id-dokumentarju iqiegħed fil-beraħ l-emozzjonijiet u t-tensjonijiet marbuta ma' din it-tradizzjoni mill-perspettiva tal-kaċċaturi, l-attivisti, u l-membri tal-komunità. Fl-istess waqt, hu jwessa' id-dibattitu lil hinn minn xtutna, filwaqt li jfakkarna fir-responsabbiltà dinjija li għandna li nħarsu l-ispeċi migratorji u nieħdu f'isieb l-ekosistemi li huma taħt pressjoni.

WOMAN OF THE SEA

This short documentary follows the journey of Nikki Muscat - a two-time Olympic swimmer for Malta - as she transitions from the chlorinated lanes of competition to the boundless, tranquil freedom of the open sea. Through breathtaking underwater visuals, all captured in a single breath, the film immerses us in the world of a freediver who has found her true home in the depths.

Woman of the Sea is a profound love letter to the Mediterranean Sea that cradles the Maltese Islands. It explores the deep, personal connection between a woman and the ocean, a relationship built on respect, peace, and a fierce sense of guardianship. The film's intimate and technically daring approach - filmed entirely without tanks - mirrors Nikki's own philosophy: that true harmony with nature requires vulnerability and presence. It is a quiet yet powerful reminder of the beauty we are privileged to live alongside and the urgent need to protect it.

Dan id-dokumentarju qasir isegwi l-vjaġġ ta' Nikki Muscat - għawwiema li rrapprezentat lil Malta fl-Olimpjadi darbtejn - hekk kif taqleb mill-korsiji tal-kompetizzjoni fil-pixxina, għal-libertà bla limitu u trankwilla tal-baħar. Permezz ta' viżwali mill-isbaħ taħt l-ilma, kollha meħuda f'nifs wieħed, il-film idaħħalna fid-dinja ta' *freediver* li sabet id-dar propja tagħha fil-fond.

Woman of the Sea hija ittra ta' mħabba qawwija lill-Baħar Mediterran li jdawwar il-Gżejjer Maltin. Id-dokumentarju jesplora l-konnessjoni profonda u personali bejn mara u l-oċean, relazzjoni mibnija fuq ir-rispett, il-paċi, u s-sens kbir ta' protezzjoni. Il-mod intimu u teknikament awdaċi tal-film - iffilmjat kollu kemm hu mingħajr tankijiet tan-nifs - jirrifletti l-filosofija ta' Nikki stess: li l-armonija vera man-natura teħtieġ vulnerabbiltà u preżenza. Il-film hu tifkira gentili iżda qawwija tas-sbuħija li aħna għandna x-xorti ngħixu hdejha u l-ħtieġa urgenti li niproteġu dan il-baħar.

Hubż u Rizz is an intimate portrait of memory, tradition, and loss in Gozo and the Maltese islands in general. Through casual yet poignant conversations, the filmmaker's father recalls a childhood spent harvesting sea urchins by the shore of San Blas, twelve children from the village with sacks of bounty, eating simply with bread by the sea. Today, the sea is empty of sea urchins, the children gone, and the beach overtaken by foreigners and tourists. What begins as a lighthearted exchange about ripened fruit and old habits shifts into a tender reflection on a "beautiful life" now vanished. Both nostalgic and mournful, the film captures the fragility of cultural memory and the irreversible changes to community and environment in a simple one shot take.

Hubż u Rizz huwa ritratt intimu ta' memorja, tradizzjoni, u telf f'Għawdex u l-Gżejjer Maltin b'mod ġenerali. Permezz ta' konversazzjonijiet każwali iżda pjuttost tad-dwejjaq, missier id-direttur tal-film jiftakar fi tfulitu li qatta' jaqbad r-rizzi max-xatt ta' San Blas, tnax mit-tfal tar-raħal bi xkejjer mimlijin, jieklu l-ħobż ħdejn il-baħar. Illum, il-baħar żvojta mir-rizzi, it-tfal sparixxew, u l-bajja ttieħdet mill-barranin u t-turisti. Dak li jibda bħala parlata ħafifa dwar il-frott lest għall-ikel u d-drawwiet qodma jinbidel f'riflessjoni tenera fuq ħajja sabiħa li issa spiċċat. Kemm nostalgiku kif ukoll ta' dieqa, il-film jikxef il-fraġilità tal-memorja kulturali u l-bidliet irriversibbli fill-komunità u fl-ambjent f'sempliċi *one shot take*.

Set in rural Catalonia, *Alcarràs* portrays the final summer of a farming family whose livelihood is threatened when their peach orchards face replacement by solar panels. Through the eyes of different generations – from playful children to weary elders – the film captures the deep bonds between land, labour, and community. It reveals the struggles of small-scale farmers caught between tradition and modernisation, and the looming loss of a way of life.

Alcarràs is both an intimate family portrait and a poignant reflection on the global forces reshaping rural landscapes. It asks what is at stake when the ties that bind us to our environment begin to fray, and invites us to reflect on resilience, belonging, and the futures we choose.

Alcarràs, ambjentat fiż-żoni rurali tal-Katalunja, juri familja ta' bdiewa li l-ġhajxien tagħhom huwa mhedded għaliex l-ortijiet tal-ħawħ tagħhom se jispiċċaw mibdula b'pannelli solari. Il-film, filwaqt li juri l-perspettivi ta' ġenerazzjonijiet differenti – minn tfal ċkejna jilagħbu sa anzjani għajjiena – jiffoka fuq ir-rabtiet qawwija bejn l-art, ix-xogħol, u l-komunità. Il-film juri t-taqbid tal-bdiewa żgħar bejn it-tradizzjoni u l-ħajja moderna, u t-telf imminenti tal-mod tal-ħajja tagħhom.

Alcarràs iservi ta' ritratt intimu tal-familja, u riflessjoni f'waqitha dwar il-forzi dinjija li qed ibiddlu l-pajsaġġi rurali. Il-film jistaqsi dwar x'se nitilfu meta r-rabtiet tagħna mal-ambjent jibdew jitfarrku, u jistedinna nirriflettu dwar ir-reżiljenza, l-appartenenza, u l-futur li nagħżlu.

Jesmark, a struggling Maltese fisherman, faces the relentless pressures of modernity. His brightly painted *luzzu* – a wooden fishing boat inherited from his father and a vivid symbol of Malta's heritage – is becoming harder to keep afloat, threatened by unsustainable fishing, crippling EU regulations and quotas, industrial change, and the shadow of the black market. The movie captures the cost of environmental and economic change on fishing communities with profound empathy, grappling with the painful choice between honouring tradition and securing a future.

Luzzu is both intimate and universal; a heartbreakingly authentic portrait of coastal communities worldwide caught between preserving their culture and surviving in a globalised economy. It's a film about the erosion of tradition, the meaning of legacy, and the difficult compromises demanded by a changing world.

Jesmark, sajjied Malti, qed jitqabad mal-ħajja waqt li jġi wiċċ imb'wiċċ mall-pressjonijiet bla waqfien tal-ħajja moderna. Huwa għandu luzzu mimli lwien – dgħajsa tas-sajd tal-injam li wiret mingħand missieru, simbolu ħaj tal-wirt Malti. Dejjem qed isir iktar diffiċli biex iżommu f'kundizzjoni tajba minħabba theddid minn sajd insostenibbli, regolamenti u kwoti iebes ta-UE, bidliet fl-industrija, u l-isfond tas-suq illegali. Il-film juri biċ-ċar u b'empatija profonda l-prezz li jkollhom iħallsu l-komunitajiet tas-sajd minħabba l-bidliet ambjentali u ekonomiċi, filwaqt li jkollhom jagħmlu l-għażla diffiċli bejn li jħarsu t-tradizzjonijiet u jassiguraw il-futur tagħhom.

Luzzu huwa film kemm intimu kif ukoll universali; ritratt awtentiku u ta' qsim il-qalb dwar il-komunitajiet li jgħixu qrib il-baħar madwar id-dinja. Dawn il-komunitajiet huma maqbuda bejn li jżommu l-kultura tagħhom u li jsalvaw f'ekonomija globalizzata. Huwa film dwar il-qerda tat-tradizzjoni, xi jfisser il-wirt, u l-kompromessi iebes li titlob dinja li qed tinbidel.

This documentary tells the remarkable story of Vandana Shiva, the Indian eco-activist and scholar who rose from a childhood in the Himalayan forests to become one of the world's most powerful voices for food sovereignty and environmental justice.

Through her fight against industrial agriculture, genetically modified crops, and corporate control of seeds, Shiva defends biodiversity and the rights of small farmers, while championing traditional knowledge and ecological balance. The film highlights how her activism is not only about protecting nature, but also about safeguarding culture, democracy, and the future of food itself. It is both a portrait of courage and a call to action – a reminder that the seeds we plant today will shape the world of tomorrow.

Dan id-dokumentarju jirrakkonta l-istorja ta' Vandana Shiva, l-eko-attivista u studjuza Indjana li kibret fil-foresti tal-Himalaja u saret waħda mill-ilhna l-aktar qawwija fid-dinja għas-sovranità tal-ikel u l-ġustizzja ambjentali.

Permezz tal-ġlieda tagħha kontra l-agrikoltura industrijali, il-ħxejjex ġenetikament modifikati, u l-kontroll korporattiv fuq iż-żrieragħ, Shiva tiddefendi l-bijodiversità u d-drittijiet tal-bdiewa żgħar, filwaqt li tiddefendi l-għarfien tradizzjonali u l-bilanċ ekoloġiku. Il-film jenfasizza kif l-attivizmu tagħha mhuwiex biss dwar il-protezzjoni tan-natura, iżda wkoll dwar il-ħarsien tal-kultura, id-demokrazija, u l-futur tal-ikel innifsu. Huwa kemm ritratt ta' kuraġġ kif ukoll sejħa għall-azzjoni – tfakkira li ż-żrieragħ li nħawlu illum se jsawru d-dinja ta' għada.

Savages is a striking stop-motion animation following a young girl who joins her anthropologist father on an expedition to Borneo. What begins as a journey of discovery quickly turns into a confrontation with the brutal realities of deforestation, species extinction, and the fragile ties between people, wildlife, and the land they share.

Blending tender, hand-crafted visuals with urgent ecological themes, the film explores the loss of innocence alongside the destruction of nature. At once intimate and universal, *Savages* is a moving tale about responsibility, interconnection, and the courage to resist exploitation. It reminds us that safeguarding the planet is not only a scientific duty but also a deeply human one.

Savages hu animazzjoni *stop-motion* impressjonanti li jsegwi l-istorja ta' tfajla li tingħaqad ma' missierha, antropologu, fi spedizzjoni lejn Borneo. Dak li jibda bħala vjaġġ ta' skoperta malajr jinbidel f'konfront mar-realtajiet brutali tad-deforestazzjoni, l-estinzjoni tal-ispeċi, u r-rabtiet fragli bejn in-nies, l-annimali selvaġġi, u l-art li jaqsmu bejniethom.

Kemm intimu kif ukoll universali, *Savages* huwa rakkont kommoventi dwar ir-responsabbiltà, l-interkonnessjoni, u l-kuraġġ għar-reżistenza tal-isfruttament. Il-film ifakkarna li l-protezzjoni tad-dinja mhuwiex biss dmir xjentifiku iżda wkoll wieħed profondament uman.

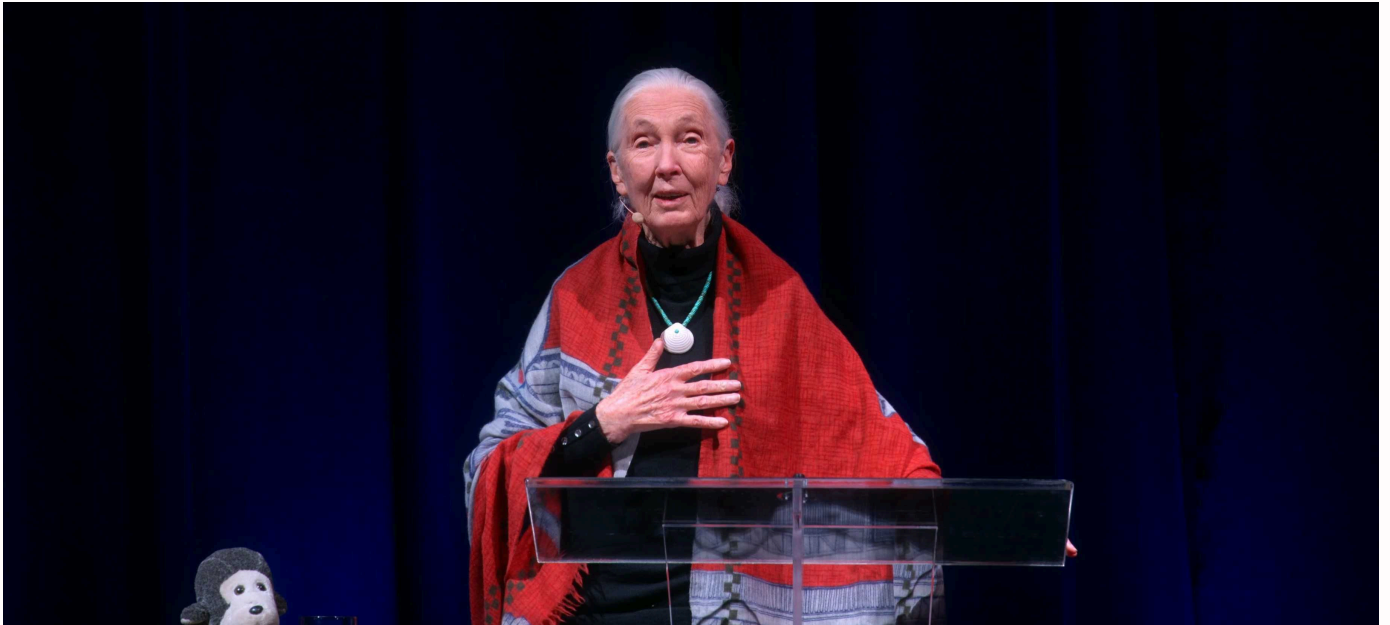

Through music, resilience, and grassroots action, The Great Green Wall becomes more than an environmental project - it is a story of hope, identity, and unity. The film shines light on cultural resistance: young Sámi artists reinventing heritage, elders safeguarding ancient practices, all working together to assert the right to exist and thrive. Existence becomes resistance - and creativity becomes a form of survival. In every song, in every ritual, in every herding journey, the Sámi remind us that respecting culture is integral to preserving our shared environmental future.

Through intimate encounters and stories, the documentary brings us closer to their resilience and the daily reality of defending a fragile ecosystem.

At its heart, the film is about resistance and care. Guided by voices within the community and the filmmakers who worked alongside them, *The Guardians of Pachamama* weaves together spirituality, identity, and activism. It reminds us that safeguarding cultural diversity and protecting the natural world are inseparable - and that the survival of one depends on the other.

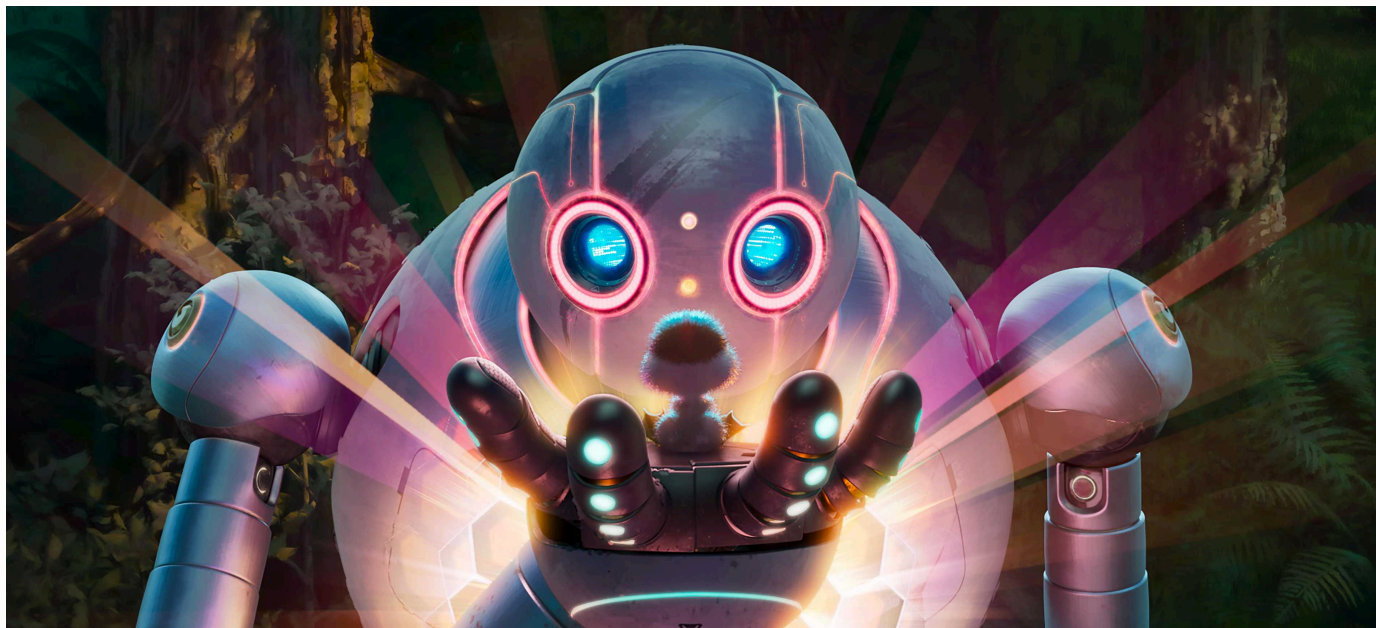

In *The Wild Robot*, a robot named Roz survives a shipwreck and finds herself stranded on an island fragmented by climate disaster, with haunting visuals of submerged cities. Her programming is rooted in human engineering, but her transformation into a nurturing guardian underscores a central message: ours is a fragile world best preserved through empathy and coexistence, not exploitation and conquest.

Roz's growing bond with the island's wildlife highlights themes of solidarity and ecosystem balance. Roz evolves from outsider to protector. Thus, the film offers a gentle commentary on AI and environmental stewardship, asking: can technology serve as caretaker rather than a conqueror or destructor? The movie offers a hopeful vision and an invitation to reimagine our technological future - one that supports, rather than undermines, the natural world.

Fil-film *A Wild Robot*, robot bl-isem ta' Roz jirnexxilha ssalva wara li d-dgħajsa li kienet fuqha tegħreq, u hi ssib ruħha fuq għira li sofriet diżastru ikkaġunat mill-bidla fil-klima, bi bliet mgħerqa taħt l-ilma. Il-programmar ta' Roz hi ħolqien tal-inġinerija umana, iżda jirnexxilha titrasforma ruħha fi protettur. Din il-bidla tenfasizza messaġġ ċentrali: id-dinja tiegħi hi fragli u tkun ippreservata aħjar bl-empatija u l-koeżistenza, mhux bl-isfruttament u l-konkwista.

Ir-rabta dejjem tikber ta' Roz mal-ispeċi tal-għira tenfasizza temi ta' solidarjetà u bilanċ fl-ekosistema. Roz tevolvi minn barranija għal gwardjan. Għalhekk, il-film joffri kummentarju ġentili dwar l-intelligenza artifiċjali u l-ħarsien tal-ambjent. Il-film jistaqsi: it-teknoloġija tista' sservi bħala xi haġa li taf tindokra, milli bħala ħakkiem jew aġent ta' qirda? Il-film joffri viżjoni ta' tama u stedina biex nimmaginaw mill-ġdid il-futur teknoloġiku tagħna - futur li jħares, u mhux jhedded, id-dinja naturali.

Behind the labels and promises of the food industry lies a troubling reality. *Food for Profit* exposes how large agribusiness and factory farming exploit animals, people, and the planet – often with political systems complicit in the cycle. Through powerful investigative storytelling, the film uncovers the hidden costs of mass production: environmental destruction, animal suffering, and public health risks.

At its core, the documentary is a call for accountability and transparency. It exposes the complicity of those that benefit from the industrial food system, and asks whether endless profit can ever outweigh the urgent need for justice, sustainability, and compassion. *Food for Profit* leaves viewers with the stark awareness that what we eat is never just about food.

Wara t-tikketti u l-wegħdiet tal-industrija tal-ikel hemm realtà inkwetanti. *Food For Profit* jesponi kif il-korporazzjoniet agrikoli kbar, u t-trobbija tal-annimali b'mod industrijali, jisfruttaw l-annimali, in-nies, u d-dinja li ngħixu fiha. Under the deep blue, Ocean reveals both wonder and alarm: coral reefs, kelp forests, marine giants, and serene seamounts juxtaposed with the devastation wrought by bottom-trawling, overfishing, and habitat and biodiversity loss. The documentary makes it clear that these aren't distant problems, but crises that threaten the very foundations of life on our planet - our survival, climate stability, and food systems.

Yet, despite the urgency, Sir David Attenborough carries a thread of hope: the ocean has a remarkable capacity for recovery. Marine protected areas are making a difference, species can recover, and action - scientific, communal, policy-driven - are proof that healing is still possible. But we need to act decisively now.

Madankollu, minkejja l-urġenza, Sir David Attenborough iħaddan ħajta ta' tama: l-oċean għandu l-kapaċità notevoli li jirkupra. Iż-żoni tal-baħar protetti qed jagħmlu differenza, diversi speċi jistgħu jirkupraw, u l-azzjoni - xjentifika, tal-komunitajiet, u tal-politiċi - huma xhieda li l-irkuprar għadu possibbli. 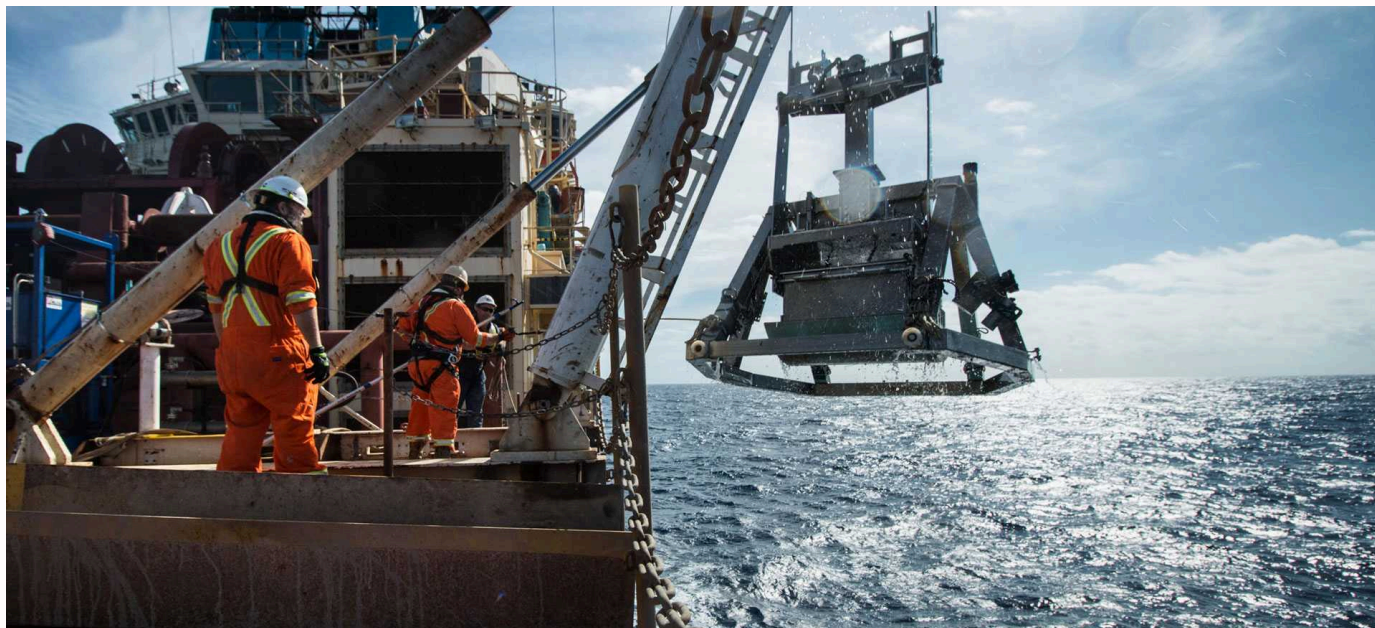

Deep Rising delves into the environmental implications of deep-sea mining, highlighting the potential destruction of the ocean's fragile ecosystems. The film underscores the urgency of protecting the Clarion-Clipperton Zone, a vast expanse of the Pacific Ocean floor rich in biodiversity and vital to Earth's carbon balance. As the demand for metals essential to green technologies like electric vehicles and renewable energy sources grows, the documentary questions the sustainability of exploiting these deep-sea resources and the ethical considerations involved.

The documentary challenges viewers to reconsider the true cost of transitioning to a green economy. It emphasizes that safeguarding the deep ocean is not merely an environmental concern but a moral imperative, urging global action to preserve this "common heritage of humankind" for future generations.

Deep Rising jesplora l-implikazzjonijiet ambjentali marbuta mat-tħaffir għar-riżorsi naturali fil-baħar, u jišħaq dwar il-potenzjal għall-qirda totali tal-ekosistemi fraġli fl-oċeani. Il-film jenfasizza l-urġenza li tigi mħarsa ż-Żona Clarion-Clipperton, medda vasta fl-Oċean Paċifiku rikka fil-bjodiversità u bżonnjuża għall-bilanċ tal-karbonju fid-dinja. Hekk kif id-domanda għall-metalli essenzjali għal teknoloġiji ħodor bħall-vetturi elettrici u s-sorsi tal-enerġija rinnovabbli tikber, id-dokumentarju jiddubita s-sostenibbiltà tal-isfruttament ta' dawn ir-riżorsi fil-baħar u l-kunsiderazzjonijiet etiċi involuti.

Id-dokumentarju jisfida lit-tele spettaturi biex jerġgħu jikkunsidraw l-ispiza vera tat-tranżizzjoni għal ekonomija ekoloġika. Jenfasizza li l-protezzjoni tal-oċean mhuwiex biss kwistjoni ambjentali iżda imperattiv morali, u jhegġeg azzjoni globali biex dan il-"wirt komuni tal-umanità" jiġi ppreżervat għall-generazzjonijiet futuri.

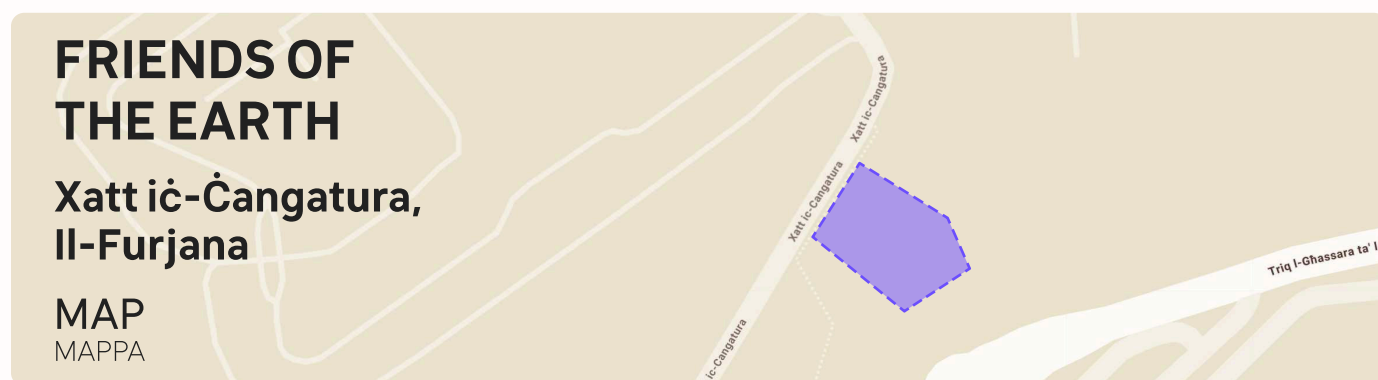
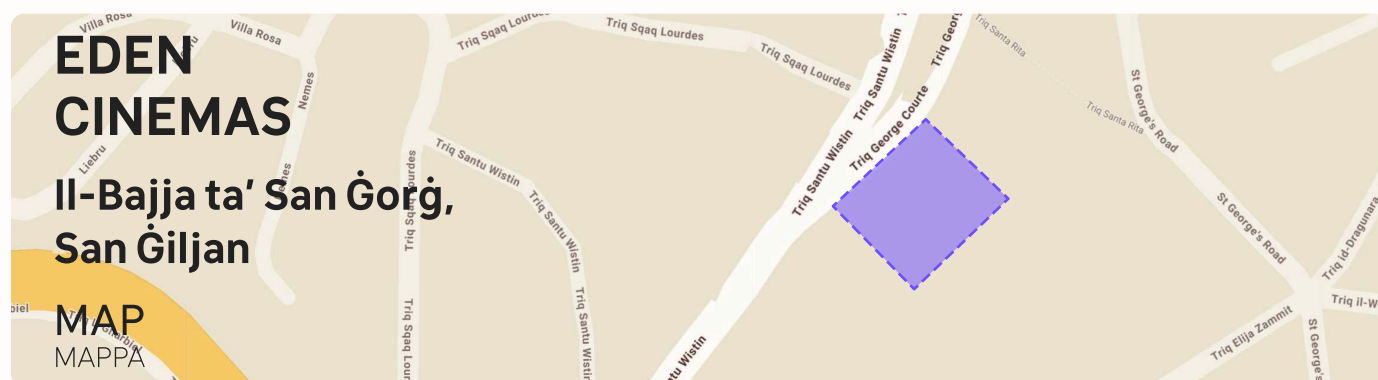

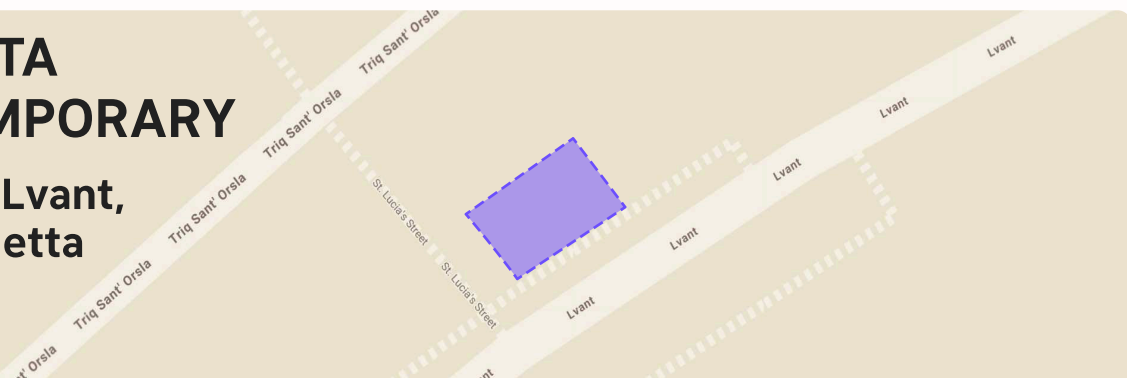
